## The Aims of Weeton Primary School

- ensure that when your child enters our school, they will be quickly assessed and be helped to settle into school life as soon as possible;
- ensure that when your child leaves our school, they will take with them relevant informative and up-to-date records and assessments which will assist their entry into their new school;
- provide a broad and balanced curriculum and meet the individual needs of your child;
- achieve high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility;
- set appropriate homework for your child and give relevant feedback upon its return;
- keep you informed about general school matters through regular newsletters, the school website (www.weeton.lancs.sch.uk) and via the school blog (weetonblogs.net).
- inform you as soon as possible, of any concerns, whether associated with your child's work, relationships or discipline;
- keep you informed about your child's progress;
- support your child to the best of our ability if they are affected by army or RAF life, especially if their father or mother is away from home for extended periods of time;
- ensure that any complaints about the school are handled sensitively and responded to as soon as possible;
- offer opportunities for you to become involved in the life of the school.
